Frameworks, models, and tools will be utilized – but only ever applied directly to what is happening in your business, family, and to support the development of you as a leader.

Delegates will gain new perspectives, practical solutions, and a trusted peer group to continue learning with long after the programme ends.

The Coaching Framework

The programme will involve conversations across five interlinked areas of awareness, which provide a framework for coaching discussions, with key questions to guide reflection and action:

- Context the market and environment you're operating in:
- What's happening in your industry, economy, or wider context?
- How do these forces shape the challenges and opportunities you face?

- > Situation the specific challenges inside your business:
- Where are the hot spots right now?
- How might you approach them in a way that brings progress and clarity?

- Dynamics the people and relationships
 - you're navigating:
- How do family and business dynamics intersect in your world?
- How can you have the conversations that really matter?
- How do you create a culture of productive feedback conversations?

- Strategic the evolution of your business:
- What do you need to do to keep the business competitive and future-fit?
- Where are you being called to innovate, grow, or adapt?
- Where do you need to respect the legacy of the past?

- > Self your leadership, style, and impact:
- What kind of leader do you want to be?
- How can you flex your leadership style according to what's needed in any given moment?
- How can you look after your "state" so that you can perform at your best?
- How can you best use your strengths

 and where do you want to stretch?
